These two words have been constantly top of mind for me during the six months since stepping away from all things Thermal. And so, with the new year (The Year of the Horse!!) comes the launch of our venture, Pacific Ridge Show Jumping.

This effort means so much to us. But it also comes with an important warning. So here it goes...

Starting in April, we'll run the first of nine weeks of competition that will take us through early October at the Los Angeles Equestrian Center (LAEC). You'll find that some of what is planned for in these shows reflect our core beliefs that will always be a part of a great horse show, and some of what is planned are new things, based on our understanding of how the sport is evolving.

Let's start with what will always matter:

1. **Run a good horse show.** First and foremost, we are in the business of running horse shows, and what matters most is doing it well. Easier said than done, but with a focus on the details that matter, e.g., schedule, ring management, footing, cleanliness, you'll know that this is our clear priority.
2. **Put horses and riders first.** This priority has perhaps not been challenged in our sport as much as it being challenged now. We are fortunate that horses give so much and we owe it to them to make sure their health and safety, and that of their human athletes, is at the forefront of everything we do.
3. **Sport over entertainment.** Sport and entertainment. Like all sports today, the line between sport and entertainment is increasingly blurred. But in the spectrum of sport to entertainment, we lean heavily toward sport. Equestrian sport is unique in that it involves both people and animals. Every day we are reminded of the special, mutual bond that makes our sport what it is, and we exist to celebrate, support, and build upon what this means to everyone.

But no doubt, the sport is changing and we need to listen, experiment, and adapt.

1. Local venues matter. It was over seven years ago that we first focused on LAEC. It is 15 minutes from our home and at 75 acres, it should be the center of the sport on the West Coast. What has become even more clear over the last few weeks, few locations on the West Coast tug at peoples heartstrings more than LAEC. We are proud to plant our home flag there and to do more than our share to return LAEC to the prominent role that it once had and needs to play once again in our sport. And we are excited by the potential that an urban home has for great horse shows.

2. Sport at all levels. Because it's critical to building our sport for the future and each level is equally important to our two legged and four-legged athletes.

3. One size does not fit all. We are excited to run a variety of horse shows, some three days long, some four days long, and some five days long. All with different highlights and emphasis. Half of our shows will be USEF Regional, the other half will be USEF National shows, and at some point, we'll make a long-term commitment to holding FEI events back in LA again.

4. Affordable. Local venues, shorter shows, reasonable fees all help address the issue of the high cost of showing. LAEC offers the opportunity to explore different ways to reduce the cost of horse showing, without compromising what makes a show great.

“What’s been most interesting is the reaction – how great peoples’ memories are of what LAEC was and how much they are excited about prospects for it to return to its glory.”



So here we go, but not without the important warning. The adage of “crawl, walk, run” has never been more important. These are our first shows at this venue, there will be lots of missteps, lots of areas where we can do better and lots of room for improvement. So please be vocal but also a bit patient.

And lastly, what’s in a name? In the end, not much. Ultimately, whether Pacific Ridge Show Jumping sticks will depend entirely on what we make of it and how you feel when you are at our shows. But our brand also pays homage to the beautiful Pacific Coast and the ridgeline above Burbank that could not offer a more beautiful, iconic and central location for a horse show.

We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible in April, and throughout our first season. In advance, let me thank you for your support and encouragement.

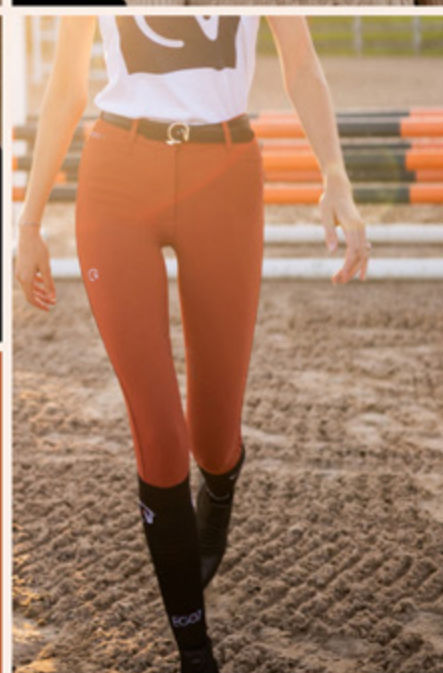
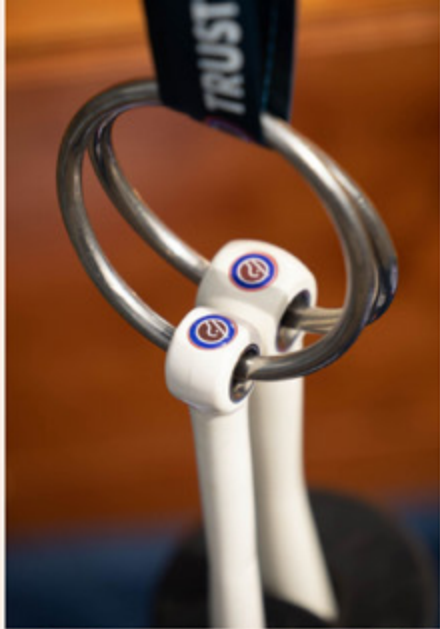

The competition is open to riders 30 and Under.

Class Format

The competition will be run as a Table II, 2b jumper class format at 1.15m. This height is challenging enough to test experienced riders and horses but is also accessible for those who are building their careers without being overly demanding on younger professional prospects or less experienced horses. Depending on the success of the initial event, additional classes at slightly different heights may be introduced in future iterations.

Class Conditions:

- This class is a jumper seat equitation class held in the jumper ring over a course of fences set at 1.15m in a Table II, 2b format.
- A jumper type horse and conventional jumper equipment will not be penalized.
- Standing and running martingales ARE permitted
- Draw reins and German martingales are NOT permitted

Course Design

Courses will be designed to be technically demanding, incorporating various types of obstacles including:

Verticals

Oxers

Triple bars

Combinations (doubles and triples)

Open water for extra points (+2) (if available)

The time allowed will be a significant factor

Judging Criteria

- The class will be judged under a modified Table II, 2b format with jumping and time faults being calculated.
- The class will be judged by two R licensed officials, one with a hunter/equitation license and one with a jumper license.
- The jumper judge will assess jumping and time faults.

- The equitation judge will award a score based on technical skill and style of riding. This score will break the tie for the riders who have an equality of faults in their jumping score.
- At the completion of the first round all riders with CLEAR rounds (no jumping or time faults) AND an equitation score of 75 or better will immediately (after the tone) complete the jump off/work off shortened course.
- The equitation judge's score for a rider's jump off round is ADDED to his or her first-round score. The rider with the least faults and the highest cumulative score is the winner.
- Two refusals will incur elimination.
- The open numerical scoring system will be used, and jumping faults and the judge's equitation score will be announced after each round. There is no need to deduct the time and jumping faults from the numerical score. The judge can do that on their card if they wish but it will not be announced. Just the jumping/time faults and the tie breaking judge's score will be announced.
- The remaining placings for the class (competitors not participating in the jump off), will be determined by the rider with the least number of faults and the highest judge's score.

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RULES & REGULATIONS

THESE COMPETITIONS ARE GOVERNED BY AND APPROVED BY THE UNITED STATES EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION. EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK AND WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH. TO THE EXTENT THERE IS A CONFLICT BETWEEN THE PRIZE LIST AND THE USEF RULES, USEF RULES WILL PREVAIL.

USEF Membership Statement: Life, Senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

AGREEMENTS AND DOCUMENTS:

USEF ENTRY AGREEMENT By entering a Federationlicensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the National Sunshine Series competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR 908.4. The Horse Show Committee reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules and Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management; its decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to limit entries in any class, section or division, to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages; to change any course, to add a dotted line, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges; to change specifications in Jumper classes as competition warrants. Every horse entered herein for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Show Management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the horse show is held blameless for any loss or accident to his horse(s), employee(s), or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. In the event of a cancellation due to severe weather or other emergency, refunds of entry fees must be made upon request by the exhibitor within 30 days of the cancellation.

REMINDER: All USEF Life and Senior Active Members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

MANAGEMENT: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision is final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit claim

damages; to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges, and to change specifications in jumper classes.

CONDITION OF ENTRY: Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show (competition) and its officials, employees, directors, officers, Los Angeles Equestrian Center, Burbank Show Management, LLC, ASM Incorporated, City of Los Angeles, and sponsoring entities harmless for any loss or accident to his/her horse, horses, employees or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK: By entering a Federation-licensed competition and signing the entry blank, the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur acknowledges that horseback riding, particularly jumping, is a dangerous activity and involves inherent risks that may cause serious injury and in some cases death because of the unpredictable nature and irrational behavior of horses, regardless of their training and past performance and expressly assumes all such inherent risks whether identified herein, in the entry blank or in the Federation Rules and Regulations. A horse, without warning or any apparent cause, can buck, stumble, fall, rear, bite, kick, run, make unpredictable movements, spook, jump obstacles, step on a person's foot, or push a person – all of which may cause the rider or observer to fall or be jolted, resulting in serious injury or death. A horse may also become loose and cause injury to an observer or rider or to another horse a loose horse can run at full gallop in a panic and run into objects or persons or other horses. The Show Ground Facilities are bordered by highways/roads and thus noise from traffic and other sources occurs that can and will cause a horse to unexpectedly spook or react quickly. The Show Ground Facilities contain roads and driveways that are traversed by cars, golf carts, tractors, trailers and heavy equipment all of which may spook a horse. The above warnings and risks are meant as an example of some of the risks that are inherent and may be encountered but it is agreed this is not an exhaustive list and there are numerous additional conditions and/or events that may result in injuries while participating in the Competition and/or being present on the Show Ground Facilities.

ENTRIES: Entries will only be accepted on line on the PRSJ website through the showgroundslive show management system. There will be a \$200 non refundable deposit per horse per week. Online entry forms must be completed in their entirety. Incomplete forms will not be accepted and will be considered a late entry, subject to a late entry fee. Classes may only be entered or declared by using a Class Number. All horses entered will be assigned a stall unless they are a facility boarder or have a pre-arranged haul-in/walk-in scheduled with management. A late fee of \$75.00 will be charged for all horses entered after the closing date of entries.

PAYMENTS: Fees must be paid in U.S. funds. Checks drawn on Canadian banks must be pre printed by a financial institution with the legend "U.S. Funds" and drawn on a U.S. bank. Visa, Master Card, & American Express are accepted. Customers paying by credit card will have an additional 3% processing fee. This fee is nonrefundable after a card has been processed. Payment information must be provided at time of entry. Full payment is required at the end of each week of competition. No balances may be rolled forward. Exhibitors and trainers who have not settled accounts prior to the beginning of the next week of competition will not be allowed to compete. Exhibitors and trainers may close out and make payment on-line. Management has permission to close out any outstanding balances with payment information provided. Stabling, nominating, and administration fees will not be refunded under any circumstances. Trainers will be held financially responsible for any clients who do not submit viable payment in a timely manner, including late fees. Accounts with returned checks/declined credit cards/disputed charges will be assessed a penalty of the greater of \$50 or 10 percent of the face value of the declined amount.

COMPETITION FEES: Each horse will be charged a USEF fee of \$25 per competition (\$15 Drugs and Medication, \$10 USEF), a \$14 fee to CDFA for Drug Screening, a \$10.00 fee for Showgroundslive, and a non refundable \$10 fee for USHJA. Anyone who is not a member of USHJA will be charged a \$30 show pass fee.

OFFICE FEES: A per horse fee of \$150 will be charged to each horse for each week of competition. Horses competing in 1.20m Jumpers and above will pay a Nomination Fee of \$150.00

REFUNDS: Unless otherwise specified, on or before the closing day of entries, full refunds will be given, less the \$150 Entry Deposit. After the closing date of entries, all class fees will be refunded minus the \$150 entry deposit. Stalls that are reserved when entering the show are refundable up until 1 week prior to the Monday of each show week. After that Monday, trainers and exhibitors are responsible for the stall fees for the stalls ordered through the show program and correspondence with the show office. Should management have to cancel competitions/classes/divisions that cannot be rescheduled due to weather and/or other emergency or unforeseen situations (natural disaster, human or equine pandemic, etc) there are no refunds on entry & stall fees & of any other fees of any kind. All refunds will be paid 30 days post competition.

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UNCOLLECTED FUNDS: ALL RETURNED CHECKS/ DECLINED CREDIT CARDS/UNPAID BALANCES WILL BE ASSESSED A 10% PENALTY. (\$100 MINIMUM). Persons will be given ten days to settle their account, with cash or cash equivalent including penalties, or be turned over to USEF & PCHA for disciplinary action.

ADD/SCRATCH/CHANGE: Any class add/scratch/ change must be made on ShowGroundslive through the PRSJ website by 4 pm on the day before the class is scheduled to run.

TRAINER SPLITS: PRSJ allows trainers to split the show charges for miscellaneous items to their clients. Splits will be accepted until noon on the Friday of a show week. No exceptions will be made. Splits must be even amongst horses or dollar amounts. Only items billed by the horse show directly can be split. Splits will revert back to the trainer for payment if uncollected.

NO DAY OF ADDS: Any exhibitor who does not compete in a class in which he/she is officially entered, and does not scratch according to the Scratch Procedures, will be billed for the class. The horse show policies herein stated regarding scratches and refunds will be followed regardless of weather and in place of GR 912. Once a class or division begins, it may not be scratched. A class that has been closed may not be scratched.

DAILY SCHEDULE: Entries for the next day must be completed by 4 pm the day before through showgroundslive on the PRSJ website. The final ring schedule will be available at approximately 6 pm for order of go sign ups. Order of go for the Equidome and medal classes will be provided by the office. Exhibitors in classes without an office provided order of go may sign up for a slot until midnight. Notices for all of these deadlines will be sent daily through the showgroundslive texting service.

PRIZE MONEY: Prize Money will be issued to the "Recipient of Prize Money" recorded on the entry within 30 days of the close of competition, thereby ending the show's responsibility as long as all criteria has been met. A valid Social Security or Federal ID number and valid address must be provided in addition to a W-9. Prize money checks will be mailed to the prize money recipient at the address on the entry blank within thirty days after the show. With advance permission from the show office, prize money may be credited to the entry's show account after the results of the class winnings are posted. If all proper tax information is not provided, the prize money will be withheld until it is provided. Classes that do not have enough entries to pay out prize money will either be cancelled, or run without prize money at the exhibitors' option. Prize money won by foreign competitors: Be advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and will be asked to complete form 8283 or complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status form. Prize money payout: Prize money payout for classes up to 20k in prize money - 30%, 22%, 15%, 8%, 7%, 6%, 6%, 6%.

Hunter prize money offered:

Spring 1: \$35,625.00 Summer 1: \$45,625.00 Summer 2: \$45,625.00 Labor Day: \$45,625.00

Hunter prize money guaranteed payout for each show is \$5,000.

STABLING: Stalls are available at Spring 1 for \$400 each per week. Stalls are available for Summer 1, Summer 2 and Labor Day for \$500 each per week. Permanent stalls of wood construction, with double dutch stall doors and dirt floors. No straw bedding will be permitted-only shavings. Management cannot guarantee stabling for post entries, and it is recommended that entries be received before the closing date. The show office handles all stall transactions and charges.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE:

Spring 1: Stalls will be available at 10:00 on Tuesday, April 7. All stalls must be vacated by Sunday, April 12.

Summer 1: Stalls will be available at 10:00 on Monday, June 22. All stalls must be vacated by Sunday, June 28 unless staying for the following week.

Summer 2: Stalls will be available at 12:00 on Monday, June 29. All stalls must be vacated by Sunday, July 5.

Labor Day: Stalls will be available at 10:00 on Monday, August 31. All stalls must be vacated by Sunday, September 6.

STABLING: The following rules will be in place for stalls. Failure to comply with stall rules will result in loss of stall usage with no refund.

- 1) Access to a barn/ tent is limited to trainers/ owners/ employees of stall/ barn rented
- 2) Strict adherence to PRSJ biosecurity rules
- 3) Curfew and quiet times must be observed between 10pm and 5am (as required by GR1215.3 #033-22)
- 4) At its discretion, PRSJ may limit tack stalls.

LAYOVER FEE: Horses remaining on the property between shows will pay a \$50 layover fee.

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DAILY HAUL-IN: Exhibitors/trainers may haul in on a daily basis for \$100 per day per horse. The daily haul in fee will be waived for horses that are 7 & Under and are competing in young horse classes at the show. Trailers must be parked in the designated lot. Horses arriving for daily haul in must meet PRSJ's biosecurity requirements.

BACK NUMBERS: One back number per horse will be assigned at each show. As per GR908.2, a signature is required on each entry blank for each rider that rides that horse. This signature is the sole responsibility of the rider. Those found riding an entry while displaying a back number assigned to others from PRSJ, without having the new rider's signature attached to that entry, assuring the owner's consent to rider, as well as agreeing to all of the rules of the competition and the Federation, will be considered in non-compliance as described in GR908.3 and will be disqualified from the class and competition until a proper entry blank is signed. Back numbers must be worn by the horse with the corresponding microchip number. All horses on the property will be required to have a back number and be registered at the office as a showing horse.

HORSE IDENTIFICATION: Horses are now required to have a back number attached to their neck or their rider when outside of their barn (as per HJ106.2 #247- 22). All horses on the property must also have current microchips registered with USEF.

USEF HORSE RECORDING: Horses must be recorded with USEF annually or for Life in order to be eligible for HOTY Awards and/or Zone Awards.

USHJA HORSE REGISTRATION: All horses competing in USEF licensed Hunter/Jumper/Eq competitions must have or obtain a Registration Number from UHSJA.

OPPORTUNITY CLASSES: All opportunity classes will be held in accordance with GR821. Riders entered only in these classes are exempt from the Federation membership requirements and are not required to pay a nonmember fee but are required to list the Federation membership number if the participant is a member.

FEED & BEDDING: All orders must be made on-line through showgroundslive.com. Prices for feed, shavings, supplements, and hay are posted on-line. Third party deliveries of feed and hay are not allowed. Exhibitors may bring their own feed, however, deliveries by outside feed companies are prohibited.

MANURE: Manure must be placed in designated areas. Trash must be kept separate from manure. Each violation will result in a \$100 fine.

SCHOOLING RULES: Per GR 801.2: ASTM approved helmets must be worn at all times while mounted. Schooling will be permitted in designated sand schooling areas only. (The word "schooling" includes, but is not limited to riding, driving, lunging, leading and exercising). Ample jumps in the appropriate areas will be provided for schooling. The rider/trainer/coach/person setting the jumps is responsible to ensure that all components of the jump are available and if such parts are not readily available, they agree to notify the paddock steward and/ or schooling supervisor. The rider/trainer/coach/person setting the jumps is also responsible to ensure the jump is set correctly in compliance with USEF rules and assumes the risk for improperly setting the jump. In accordance with Nevada state law, poling and/or the use of offsets WILL NOT be permitted. Violations of schooling regulations may be considered cause for FINES and/or ELIMINATION and can be instituted by the official schooling supervisor, paddock master, official USEF Steward or any member of management should the situation arise.

CLOSED RINGS: Show Arenas are closed at all times when not being used for competition and designated schooling breaks/ sessions. Violations of the above will be considered cause for Fines and/or Elimination from any and all further competition. Please see the schooling schedule at the show office.

POLING, LUNGEING AND OFFSETS: Manual poling and the use of bamboo offsets are prohibited for all horses competing at DIHP pursuant GR844. Any rider, trainer, groom or any other person who is in violation of the rules set forth above will be fined \$500 for each incident and may be suspended from further competition. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/ or use of bamboo off-sets rule will be suspended from competition. Lungeing is only allowed in designated areas.

EXCESSIVE LUNGEING: Lungeing a visibly exhausted horse; lunging an obviously lame horse; chasing a horse with a lunge whip or other inappropriate use of the whip; the use of a lunge whip with any type of appendage or attachment, including but not limited to bags and flags; excessive and/or disruptive cracking of the whip have all now been added to the list of prohibited acts under the Horse Welfare rules for Hunters, Jumpers, and Hunter/Jumper Seat Equitation per EQ104.1, HU100.1, and JP102.2 (#249-22).

RULES & REGULATIONS

NUMBERS: Horses are required to have their correct Horse Show Entry number attached whenever they are exhibiting & exercising. Not wearing a number while competing may constitute elimination.

CONFLICTS: It is the intention of Horse Show Management to avoid holding rings to wait for horses and/ or riders. Riders with conflicts must arrange their jumping order with the starters so that they will not hold up a class. Paddock Stewards have the authority to scratch riders who are not timely. Trainer conflicts are not considered legitimate conflicts.

DOGS: USEF GR1301.6 states that dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be held on a leash or otherwise constrained at all times. Individuals may not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses, or actions resulting from their dogs' behavior. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule will be issued a Yellow Card and may be subject to penalty under Chapter 7.

PARKING: All vehicles must be parked in designated parking areas. Unauthorized vehicles in non-designated parking areas or permit-only parking areas are subject to being towed away at owner's expense.

NON SMOKING EVENT: The events included in this prize list are non smoking events in accordance with California State Law SB-977 Tobacco: youth sports events.

RV PARKING: RV parking is available at \$500 per week, first come, first serve. Power and water are provided. An outside pump out service company is available at the owners expense.

SHOW OFFICE HOURS: The PRSJ show office is open from 7:00am to 4:00pm each day. All transactions can be made on-line by accessing showgroundslive on our website.

BRAIDING: Braiding is optional and horses that are not braided will not be penalized.

MAIL/TELEPHONE: All mail during the show should be sent to exhibitors as follows: c/o Horse Show Office, Los Angeles Equestrian Center, 480 Riverside Dr, Burbank, CA 91506. Phone numbers: (818) 987-3336.

MEDICAL WASTE: Sharps must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found in violation shall be subject to a fine.

DRUG TESTING: The horse show will be conducted under the auspices of the Nevada Department of Agriculture and USEF.

ARENAS: All warm-up and competition arenas contain sand/textile footing. Dimensions are:

Hap Hansen Arena-150' x 284'

Equidome-150' x 300'

East Ring-139' x 270'

Allen Arena East & West-150' x 300'

MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS: Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

RULES & REGULATIONS

MEASUREMENT CARDS: All ponies & junior hunters are required to possess a current USEF Measurement Card or valid measurement form issued by USEF and it must be shown at the horse show office before numbers are released. Measurements are available to be conducted during all horse show days - see show office for scheduling.

ATTIRE: Formal attire is required for all Finals, Classics & Classes. Proper Attire is required in all classes. Riding coats of any color are required. Breeches must be light color (white or fawn). Pastel and dark colored breeches are not allowed. Shirts, light in color, must be tucked into breeches and fastened at the top of the neck. Ties or chokers of any color must be worn (unless the shirt, by design, has the choker built in for its intended use). Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn. ASTM approved helmets must be worn at all times while mounted.

FOOD PAVILION: PRSJ offers a range of food trucks throughout the show weeks.

COVID-19: PRSJ will adhere to any and all COVID-19 protocols as required by USEF, State of California and the City of Los Angeles, and County of Los Angeles in place at the time of the show. All individuals entering LAEC must abide by these requirements.

STATEMENT OF HEALTH / VACCINATIONS: Per GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule: At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Please consult pacificridgeshowjumping.com for latest updates regarding all Biosecurity requirements for access and participation.

SAFETY, HEALTH & VETERINARY: SHARPS AND MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, BioHazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. Sharps & Medical Waste must be placed in the proper receptacles. Anyone found discarding sharps or medical waste in any other manner will be fined up to \$250 per instance and be responsible for any fines and expenses incurred by management.

SAFETY: Accidents Involving Competitors. GR1317. In the event of a head injury due to a fall/accident at a licensed competition, the competitor may be prohibited from further competition until released by medical personnel. In some cases, the competitor may not return to competition without a signed release from a licensed medical professional. The competitor may be placed on suspension by USEF until a release is provided. Competitors are advised to familiarize themselves with this rule.

NON-SMOKING EVENT: These events are non-smoking events and fall under California Code, Health and Safety Code - HSC § 104495. Violators may be fined.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/ jumper competitions in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes, when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/ SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is the responsibility of the rider, or the parent or guardian or trainer of the junior exhibitor to see to it that the headgear worn complies with appropriate safety standards for protective headgear intended for equestrian use, and is properly fitted and in good condition, and the Federation, Show Committee and Licensed Official are not responsible for checking headgear worn for such compliance. GR 801.2.7.

MICROCHIP VERIFICATION: All horses competing in classes that require USHJA horse registration must provide a microchip number that verifies their animal's identity in order to compete for points, money won or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards where horses are required to be recorded or registered. A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen-digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip and be implanted in the nuchal ligament of the animal. All horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions, Exceptions: USHJA Outreach and those activities enumerated in GR901.9, items 1-9. As of 12/1/2025, all horses competing in USEF-licensed and endorsed competitions must have a 15-digit ISO compliant microchip attached the USEF Horse ID record prior to competing, If you do not know your horse's USEF Horse ID, you can check under the "Your Horses" section of your USEF member dashboard or you can search for the horse using the USEF horse search (<https://www.usef.org/search/horses>). The horse search will display your horse's microchip if it has been reported to USEF. If there is no microchip displayed you can use the online microchip reporting tool (<https://members.usef.org/horses/microchip-search>) to add the microchip to your horse's record.

RULES & REGULATIONS

COMBINING/SPLITTING OF CLASSES: IN ALL RATED HUNTER SECTIONS – Should entries warrant, all rated hunter sections will be split or combined following USEF rules and will be done so by 3pm the day preceding the first class in each section therefore entries **MUST** be completed for rated hunter divisions accordingly to be considered. Any post-adds received and accepted after this time will not be considered in respect to the splitting/ combining numbers. There will be no exceptions to this policy. After 3pm the day prior, scratches and/or “no-shows” at the gate in all rated hunter sections will forfeit their entry fee unless a Certificate from the Official Show Veterinarian vet scratch for the show is received by the official show secretary prior to the section in question. “Non-showing” fees will be assessed accordingly.

DAMAGE: Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.

ADHERENCE TO THE RULES: All individuals associated with the show on the property are required to adhere to the rules mentioned in the prize list or as directed by the employees at the venue. Trainers are all responsible for employees adhering to the rules. Violations will result in expulsion from the facility.

B. In accordance with GR1111.4: All members may compete for Zone Awards or money in any state contiguous to Zone 10: OR, ID, UT, AZ

JUDGING FOR ALL HUNTER SECTIONS: To be judged on performance and soundness, suitability to count.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADULT AMATEURS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION: To be ridden by exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year and who hold a current USEF Amateur certification. Open to horses and ponies.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN'S SECTIONS: HUNTER, JUMPER AND EQUITATION: To be ridden by exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER Sections offered and requirements: Adult Amateurs – may be split into three (3) sections.

Cross Entry: Riders: Riders may not cross enter into any Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9" or High Performance Hunter class at the same competition. Exception - under saddle classes. Adult Amateur Riders may not cross enter into any class at the same competition with fences exceeding 3'3" except Jumper Classes not exceeding 1.25m, Equitation and Medal Classes, and the USHJA National Hunter Derby. Riders may cross enter between the Adult Amateur Hunter and the 3'3" Amateur Owner section if the rider owns the horse he or she is showing in the Adult Amateur section. An Adult Amateur rider may ride an Amateur Owner Hunter in the A/O Under Saddle Class for an Amateur Owner Hunter rider that has more than one horse entered. No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. **Horses:** Horses may not cross enter into any Amateur Owner hunter class (at the same show). No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. **Horse and Rider Combination:** No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. **Fence Height:** 3'0" with spreads not to exceed the fence height. Courses will not be adjusted for ponies. In and outs are permitted. **Classics:** Three (3) entries are required to conduct a Hunter Classic. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** May be split into three (3) sections: Adult Amateurs 18–35, Adult Amateurs 36–49, Adult Amateurs 50 & Over. If there are fewer than three (3) entries, the Adult Amateur Hunter section may be combined with the Children's Hunter Horse section. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Adult Amateur Hunter 18–35, Adult Amateur 36–49, Adult Amateurs 50 & Over.

LOW ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year. **Cross Entry: Riders:** Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 3'0" **Fence Height:** 2'6" **Combining/Dividing Sections:** If there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Low Adult Amateur Hunter section, it may be combined with the Low Children's Hunter Horse section. The Low Adult Amateur Hunter Horse section may only be combined with the Children's Hunter Pony and Low Children's Hunter Horse sections after those sections have been combined and still do not meet the three (3) entry minimum. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section: Low Adult Amateur Hunter.

AMATEUR JUMPER: Sections offered and requirements: 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper, 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper. **Cross Entry:** No cross entry restrictions at one day competitions. **Rider:** Any competitor that competes in any class set at over 1.25m is ineligible to compete in an Amateur Jumper class set below 1.20m at that competition. **Horse/Pony:** n/a. **Horse and Rider Combination:** n/a. **Fence Height:** Amateur Jumper 1.00m to 1.05m. Amateur Jumper 1.10m for the first class of the section. In all other classes of the section fences to be set no lower than 1.10m and no higher than 1.15m. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** 1.00/1.05m Junior's and 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than three (3) in either section and may combine if there are fewer than six (6) in either section. If after combining the 1.00/1.05m sections there are fewer than three (3) entries then competition management must further combine the 1.00/1.05m sections with the 1.10/1.15m sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. 1.10/1.15m Junior's and 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than three (3) in either section and may combine if there are fewer than six (6) in either section. If after combining the 1.10/1.15m sections there are fewer than three (3) entries then competition management must further combine the 1.10/1.15m sections with the 1.00/1.05m sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper, 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper.

AGE GROUP EQUITATION: ADULT SECTION Refer to GR1131. **Fence Height:** Fence heights cannot exceed 3'5" and wings are optional. To be shown over a course of not fewer than eight fences. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** If the adult equitation does not fill it must be combined with a junior or child section. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Equitation 18- 35, Equitation 36 and Over.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE Sections offered and requirements: Children's Hunter Horse. **Cross Entry: Rider:** Riders may not cross enter into any Junior Hunter, Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9" or High Performance Hunter class at the same show. Exception - under saddle classes. Children's riders may not cross enter into any class at the same competition

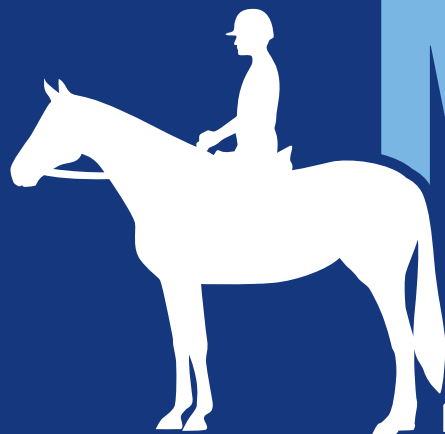
with fences exceeding 3'3" (exception: Jumper Classes not exceeding 1.25m, Equitation and Medal Classes, and the USHJA National Hunter Derby). A Children's Hunter rider may ride a Junior Hunter in the Junior Hunter Under Saddle class for a Junior Hunter rider that has more than one horse entered. No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. **Horses/Ponies:** Horses may not cross enter into any 3'6" Junior Hunter Class at the same competition. No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. **Horse and rider combination:** No cross entry restrictions at one-day competitions. Classics: Three (3) entries are required to conduct a Hunter Classic. **Fence Height:** 3'0" with spreads not to exceed fence height. In and outs are permitted. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** If there are fewer than three (3) entries, the Children's Hunter section may be combined with the Adult Amateur Hunter section. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Children's Hunter Horse.

LOW CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have not yet reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year. **Cross Entry: Riders:** Riders may not cross enter at the same competition into any class/section where fences exceed 3'0" **Fence Height:** 2'6" **Combining/Dividing Sections:** If there are fewer than three (3) horses entered in the Low Children's Hunter Horse section, then they may be combined and judged with the Children's Hunter Ponies or the Low Adult Amateur Hunter section. If there are still fewer than three (3) entries after the Children's Hunter Pony section has been combined with the Low Children's Hunter Horse section, these sections may only then combine with the Low Adult Amateur Hunter Horse section. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following section: Low Children's Hunter Horse.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY Sections offered and requirements: Small/Medium Children's Pony, Large Children's Pony. **Cross Entry: Rider:** Rider may not cross enter in any division where the fences exceed 3'3" (exception: Children's Jumper sections). **Horse/Pony:** n/a. **Horse and Rider Combination:** n/a. **Fence Height:** Small/Medium Ponies: 2'0"; spreads not to exceed height of fence. Large Ponies: 2'6"; spreads not to exceed height of fence. In and outs are not permitted. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** If there are fewer than three (3) ponies in the Children's Hunter Small/Medium Pony or Children's Hunter Large Pony, then the classes may be combined and judged together. If there are still fewer than three (3) ponies after the Small/Medium and Large sections have been combined, the Children's Hunter Pony sections may combine with the Low Children's Hunter Horse section. If there are still fewer than three (3) entries after the Children's Hunter Small/Medium and Large Pony sections have been combined with the Low Children's Hunter Horse section, these sections may only then combine with the Low Adult Amateur Hunter Horse section. **Classics:** A minimum of three (3) entries are required to conduct a Children's Hunter Pony Classic. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Children's Hunter Pony.

JUNIOR JUMPER Sections offered and Requirements: 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper, 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper. **Cross Entry:** No cross entry restrictions at one day competitions. **Rider:** Any competitor that competes in any class set at over 1.25m is ineligible to compete in a Junior Jumper class set below 1.20m at that competition. **Horse/Pony:** n/a. **Horse and Rider Combination:** n/a. **Fence Height:** Junior Jumper 1.00m to 1.05m. Junior Jumper 1.10m for the first class of the section. In all other classes of the section fences to be set no lower than 1.10m and no higher than 1.15m. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** 1.00/1.05m Junior and 1.00/1.05m Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than three (3) in either section and may combine if there are fewer than six (6) in either section. If after combining the 1.00/1.05m sections there are fewer than three (3) entries then competition management must further combine the 1.00/1.05m sections with the 1.10/1.15m sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. 1.10/1.15m Junior and 1.10/1.15m Amateur Jumper sections must combine if there are fewer than three (3) in either section and may combine if there are fewer than six (6) in either section. If after combining the 1.10/1.15m sections there are fewer than three (3) entries then competition management must further combine the 1.10/1.15m sections with the 1.00/1.05m sections, allowing each section to compete at their respective height. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: 1.00/1.05m Junior Jumper section, 1.10/1.15m Junior Jumper section.

AGE GROUP EQUITATION: CHILDREN'S/JUNIOR SECTION Refer to GR1131. **Fence Height: Equitation 11 & Under:** Minimum 2'6", maximum 2'9" - management must state height at which class will be offered. Management may offer multiple height options if stated in the prize list, but each course must be set at the same height throughout. Combinations not permitted. **Equitation 12- 14:** Minimum 2'9", maximum 3'3" - management must state height at which class will be offered. Management may offer multiple height options if stated in the prize list, but each course must be set at the same height throughout. Combinations are optional. **Equitation 15- 17:** Minimum 3'0", maximum 3'5" - management must state height at which class will be offered. Management may offer multiple height options if stated in the prize list, but each course must be set at the same height throughout. Combinations are optional. **Combining/Dividing Sections:** Competition management may offer Age Group Equitation classes divided at their discretion. Equitation that is offered by age will be awarded points that will be credited to the age groups defined in GR1131 or the relevant Zone Specifications. If the Equitation 11 & Under section is combined with the Equitation 12-14 section, the combined section will be run in accordance with the Equitation 12-14 specifications with optional combinations. **Awards:** Zone Horse of the Year Awards will be presented annually to the following sections: Equitation 11 & Under, Equitation 12-14, Equitation 15-17.



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
